
#### News from our Gaelic P2 Class

In Primary Three children start to join the Accelerated Reading scheme. They continue with this throughout their time in Mount Pleasant. This is a reading scheme that allows them to read various books both in school and at home. Once they have read the book they quiz on the computer at school. The guizzes focus on comprehension and word meaning. You are able to see how well your child does by accessing Renaissance Home Connect. If you'd like to receive emails showing your child's quiz results, click the Email Setup link in Renaissance Home Connect and follow the directions. The children all should know what reading level they are at alternatively this can be found on Home Connect.
